

## **NOTICE 003 - National Team Eligibility Rules**

On the occasion of the meeting of the ICTSC on February 26<sup>th</sup> 2016 the ICTSC ratified the following agreement which came into force on January 1st 2016 on the criteria which should determine the eligibility of a shooter to be selected for one of the national teams of the ICTSC member associations.

<u>Association Representation</u> - Any shooter shall be eligible to shoot for the representative team only if he/she is a member of the relevant association and fulfills one of the following conditions.

- a) He/she was born on the territory of the relevant association.
- b) His/her biological mother or biological father was born on the territory of the relevant association.
- c) His/her grandmother or grandfather was born on the territory of the relevant association.
- d) He/she has lived continuously for at least two (2) years on the territory of the relevant association prior to qualification.
- e) He/she is married to a national of the relevant association.

Further to the above it is agreed that ICPSA or UCPSA members can choose to shoot for whichever of the two associations they prefer but, having taken the opportunity to shoot for that association, they will then be bound by the same ruling as the other associations in terms of changing association representation. <u>Changing Association Representation</u> - Any shooter who has represented an association in any ICTSC competition of any category shall be eligible to shoot for the representative team of another association only if he/she fulfills <u>all</u> of the following conditions in addition to the above.

- a) The shooter has not shot for any national team for a minimum of two (2) calendar years prior to the decision to transfer.
- b) The shooter makes a written request to the association to whom he/she wishes to transfer before 1st January.
- c) The receiving association proposes the transfer for approval at the first ICTSC meeting of the calendar year.
- d) The receiving association obtains written approval from the ICTSC.
